- 2. Inclusivity Statement: The commitment to inclusivity through waived publication fees for authors from diverse backgrounds is commendable. However, providing specific details or criteria for what constitutes "diverse backgrounds" would add transparency and clarity.



- 3. Open Peer Review System: The mention of an open peer review system is encouraging. Elaborating on the mechanisms in place to ensure the effectiveness of this system and how it aligns with the journal's commitment to transparency could enhance reader confidence.
- 4. Ethical Considerations: The emphasis on obtaining Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval for research involving human participants is crucial. It might be beneficial to provide a brief reference or link to resources guiding authors through the IRB approval process.

Moving on to the section addressing plagiarism and the use of AI-generated content, the policies outlined are robust and aligned with best practices in academic publishing. However, there are a few points for consideration:

- 1. AI-Generated Text Detection: While the journal rightly addresses the issue of AI-generated text, it might be beneficial to briefly outline the technology or tools used for detection to assure authors of the rigor of the screening process.
- 2. AI Chatbots: The encouragement for authors to use AI chatbots responsibly is noteworthy. Offering some examples or guidelines on what constitutes moderate and judicious use of AI chatbots could assist authors in navigating this recommendation.

The editorial team's dedication to maintaining high academic and ethical standards is evident throughout the manuscript. The outlined policies and commitments reflect a thoughtful approach to ensuring the credibility and originality of published content. I appreciate the opportunity to review this document and look forward to witnessing the Tun J of Sport Sci Med contribute significantly to the global discourse in sports science and medicine.

- 4. You have exceeded 7 keywords (10 keywords) which you mentioned in the journal guidelines "**Keywords**:Provide between 3 and 7 keywords. Opt for MeSH terms and avoid citing as key words some terms previously cited in the title or the abstract"
- 5. References: display the date of last access to the website.
